



CORONAVIRUS AID, RELIEF, AND ECONOMIC SECURITY ACT (CARES ACT)-Section 18004

HIGHER EDUCATION EMERGENCY RELIEF FUND (HEERF) REPORTING

EMERGENCY FINANCIAL AID GRANTS TO STUDENTS

- 1) Buckeye Career Center signed and returned the CARES HEERF Certification and Agreement for Student's Portion on May 12, 2020; and approval for the Grant award was received on May 15, 2020. In this agreement, BCC agreed to use no less than 50 percent of the funds received under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students.
- 2) The total amount of funds available to Buckeye Career Center for distribution of Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students is \$118,342.
- 3) The total amount of Emergency Financial Aid Grants distributed to students under Section 18004(a)(1) is \$118,342 distributed in June 2020.
- 4) There were 96 students at Buckeye Career Center that were deemed eligible to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act.
- 5) As of June 15, 2020; a total of 56 students received an Emergency Financial Aid Grant under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act.
- 6) The institution determined that active students that were enrolled in a 600-hour or longer program as of March 1, 2020 and were still in an active enrollment status as the date of campus shutdown on March 16, 2020 due to coronavirus are deemed eligible to receive the Emergency Financial Aid Grant for students. Students had to certify that they incurred expenses related to the disruption of campus operations due to coronavirus and will utilize the emergency grant relief funds to cover these associated costs. All 96 eligible students were required to return a form to request emergency financial aid grant funds. Once all the replies were received as of May 4, 2020; the institution formulated the actual check amounts based on utilizing the maximum grant funds available and divided evenly among students who returned the required form requesting funds.
- 7) The 96 students that were eligible to receive the Emergency Financial Aid Grant were required to return a form certifying that they incurred eligible expenses related to the disruption of campus operations due to coronavirus. Eligible expenses were explained to include food, housing, course materials, technology, health care, and child care.
